Use historical railway posters and their Art Deco influences to inspire your work. This stylised imagery will give you the opportunity of exploring new ways to represent subject matter.

Media: Week 9 Use drawing to create your compositions from the visual resources provided. It is important that you

consider the shapes, colours and design of the period.

Week 10 Use painting processes used this term to create your work (i.e. pen, watercolour, acylics etc)

Artists: Frank Sherwin (1896-1968), Terence Cuneo (1907-1953), Frank Mason (1875 - ?), Norman Wilkinson (1878-1971)

Art Deco (1910-1930)

This style is regarded as the natural successor to Art Nouveau replacing the symmetrical flowing lines of natural growth with stylised, geometric shapes.



Major influences in the development of the Art Deco style were Cubism and artefacts from Tut-ank-amun's tomb. Art Deco inspired everything including art, design, fashion, furniture, architecture, motor vehicles and jewellery.

On 3rd February 1931 a massive 7.9 earthquake and resulting fire, destroyed the town of Napier in New Zealand. The town was rebuilt in the Art Deco Style which remains to this day.
